Alexandria, VA, June 2, 2008 — Flight Safety Foundation and AviAssist Foundation announced today that the two organizations have developed a partnership to address aviation safety and security issues in the East and Southern African (ESAF) region.

“Statistically, this region is one of the least safe in the world,” said AviAssist Director Tom Kok. “With the rapid growth of tourism and international business, it is vital that ESAF addresses these safety concerns and makes aviation as safe here as anywhere else in the world. Some countries and companies have done a brilliant job in improving their systems and can’t wait to tell their stories. The current system hides those heroes.
